

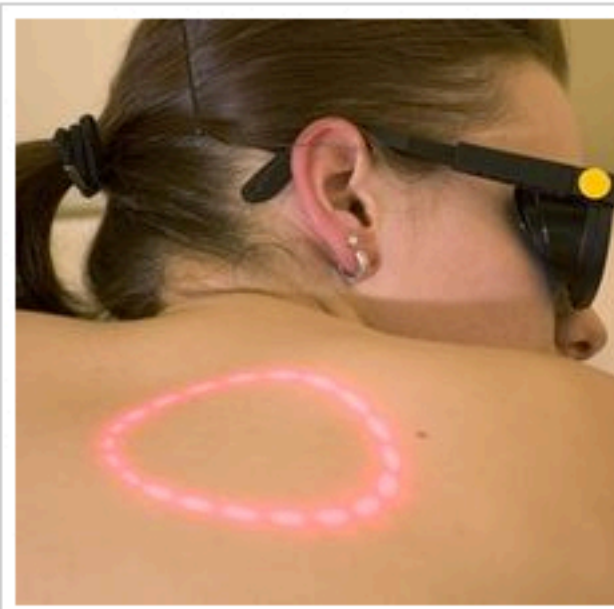
Laser Training for Nurses

Training
